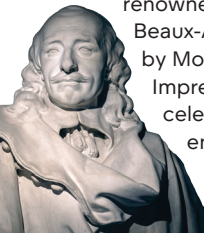

The Fruit Road by bike

The scenic “Fruit Road” winds through 60 kilometres of picturesque orchards. Jumièges Abbey

A jewel of the Seine Valley, Jumièges Abbey is a testament to the influence of one of the most important monasteries in Western Europe. Its ruins, unique in Europe, unveil over a thousand years of Normandy's history. The abbey's open-air nave and surrounding natural environment create a romantic setting, praised by artists like Turner and Victor Hugo, who called it «the most beautiful ruin in France.».

Rouen was a trailblazer during France's Industrial Revolution in the 19th century. Towering mills, bustling workshops, and factories formed the city's very fabric.

Rouen's port boasts a rich history stretching back over 2,000 years. It has always been a key player in the city's development as a major centre of maritime activity and trade.

Delve into Rouen's industrial past

Travel back in time to the 19th century with a visit to the Corderie Vallois rope factory in the Cailly Valley. This museum is a treat for all the senses, featuring an original hydraulic spinning mill and machinery that's still operational today! Just a short hop away, step inside the workshop and boutique of «Les Confiseurs,» housed in a former industrial site, and discover how the famous local "apple sugar" candy is made!

Curious minds of all ages will be fascinated by what they discover. A walk along the banks of the Rivers Aubette and Robec on Rouen's eastern side brings this industrial past to life. You'll be following the exact locations of former mills used in the textile industry, particularly for dyeing and tanning.
